Michael Jones, An Open Letter to Parents Everywhere

- ...Yelling "Shoot, Jenny, shoot" to a player who is approaching the (basket) with the ball does a number of destructive things. First, it tells every player on the opposing team that Jenny is about to shoot, therefore lessening considerably her chances of success. Secondly, it makes Jenny feel she has no choice but to shoot, and that if she doesn't shoot, she is somehow letting the team down. Worst of all, it let's Jenny off the hook. Now she doesn't have to actually think and make a decision herself about what to do. All she has to do is obey the instruction.
- For kids of this age, obeying instructions from an adult comes far more naturally to them than making decisions of their own. But (basketball) is a sport where the players have to make the decisions themselves, literally thousands of small split-second decisions every game. The younger they start, the better.

So please don't yell specific instructions to players during games...

Jenna Kriensky, current Senior at Newton South High School-Played basketball from 2nd grade - 8th grade -Played NGBA, Metrowest, and AAU -→ Played basketball competitively, but got cut short by Covid-19-Have worked with the NGBA since freshman year of high school Why do I care about this?-Although I have loved my teams and coaches, I have had some negative coaching experiences which severely tainted how I view basketball



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Main takeaways

- Coaching matters
- These sports psychologists are working with athletes at a much higher level, and still see cases of players playing worse and losing confidence even when they are some of the best
- In summary of our exchanges, positive language is crucial
- At this age and any, it's all about confidence —> the most important thing is that they have fun and develop a love for the game
- Reality is: not many kids play college sports —> this stage is for fun, not tough love



CORI

- Criminal Offense Records Investigation CORI Newton Girls Basketball

 criminal history request form. NGBA submits these forms to the Department of Criminal Justice Information Services (DCJIS)
 which provides information on a confidential basis to the NGBA President. The form must be completed in full and returned
 before an individual can be a coach, referee or board member. Coaches shall not receive a roster until the form has been
 submitted. Please note:
- You must include a quality digital photo of a US government-issued ID e.g., Driver's License.
- A completed signed CORI Acknowledgement form (<u>Download the CORI form</u>)
- Within the text of the email, send the following information in the following order:
 - Last Name
 - First Name
 - Middle Initial
 - DOB (MMDDYYYY)
 - Last 6 digits of SSN

Beginning the Season

- Head Coach, Assistant Coach have been assigned, Team Manager is helpful.
- Parents Volunteers for scoresheet/Clock
- Contact Parents immediately:
 - Team information, practice day/time/location, game schedule, rules including absolutely no jewelry including earrings for games or practices, parent and child conduct

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Coaching Tips

- Over-communicate to parents (send weekly emails)
- Start the season with a party/parents meeting:
 - Discuss your goals for the season, why your coaching, etc.
 - Game behavior (cheering, 0 tolerance refs, etc.)
 - Encouragement of their children
 - Early Arrival times: 15min games, 5-10 minutes practices
 - Medical information you need & Cell Tel Numbers of parents
 - · Parents must inform you if daughter will miss practice/game
 - Weather-related cancellations
- Maintain structure, discipline, set consistent rules
- Say something positive to each girl
- Corrections should be done in private when possible

Practices

- No Lines, No Lectures, No Laps
- 5-10 minutes warm-up (outside the gym)
- 10 minutes of dribbling, warm-up, and stretching as a group
 - Include both R and L hand dribbling
 - Proper dribbling technique
 - Crossovers
 - Figure 8's
 - Protecting the ball
- Break into 2 groups when possible (20min)
 - Pivoting / Rebounding & Positioning
 - Bounce/Chest Pass / Give & Go
 - How to play D / Picks
 - Lay-ups /Shooting technique
 - 3 v 2, 2 v 1
- Finish with 30min scrimmage

Games

- Equal playing time for all girls (matrix available)
- 4 (ten) minute quarters for grades 3 OR 2 (twenty) minute halves for grades 4/5, 6/7 & 8/9
- Games (clocks) start 5-min past the hour -
- Subbing at the quarters (grade 3), Grades 4-9 (every 5 minutes within 30 seconds)
- 1 Timeout/half (time permitting)
- How to handle lopsided games
- Coaches/Team sits alone (no friends, siblings, etc.)
- Minimize sideline coaching
- Zero Tolerance Rule
- Defensive matchups
- No Jewelry Enforced
- Focus on sportsmanship & Fun
 - Cheer for the other team

Referees

- Both High School & Adult Refs
- Many are
 - Volunteers
 - Just learning this season!
- Please be courteous and thank the ref
- Zero tolerance!
 - 2nd Infraction Technical Foul (coach ejection)
- Coaches meet with refs pre-game & halftime
- Contact Grade Coordinator if there are issues
- The referees role is:
 - Keeping it safe
 - Teach the players
 - Keeping it fair

What we have told the Referees

- Control the game
 - Blow the whistle loud!!
 - Call early fouls on aggressive players
 - Call jump balls quickly/immediately
- Run with the game
- Use your judgment on all calls
 - Keep the game moving
 - Take player/team ability into account
- No jewelry PERIOD
